The area below keeps track of all incidents on the mountain so Whitewater understands hazards, trends, and where improvements can be made.

- First aid statistics / summary (Aug 3 Dec 19, 2023, late opening Dec 15th)
 - o Shoulder slip and fall, felt shoulder pop in and out. Worksafe claim No Lost Time, monitoring & Physio
 - o Right Heel Post holing with snowblower, pain started the next day. No Lost time, monitoring.
 - o Struck by Handle of recycling bin freespun and struck hand. No lost time, monitoring. Investigation shows snow load had a part to play in this incident. Usually the lid is cleared; however, due to it being preseason and early snow it was not. The handle got away from him. Lid is clearly usually daily as recycling is dumped more frequently.

In discussion, when someone is utilizing the bin, if you hear the clicking that means it's engaged. Injury probably didn't happen due to snow load as originally thought but due to the temps and lock freezing.

- Action: Joel to chat with loader operators to update.
- o Right Knee Strain Was riding down from relieving SKT when she caught an edge and twisted her knee. Felt nausea from Pain. Was taken to the Hospital. Looking to bring back on modified duties. Lost time.

Round Table:

Lifts/Millwrights

- OHS concern is the marginal conditions, reminding staff to stay safe and ride carefully.
- Hydraulic press is old unsafe. Issue is the pushing of bearings into the sheaves- hydraulic pressure.
 - o Usage way more in the summer.
 - Dave & Ed looking at cost replacement.
 - Wanted this item on JOHSC as recorded at the meeting
 - Safety issue: decreases stability during tasks.

Snow School

Ventilation - no air flow, smell increases. Can the springs be loosened so the door can stay open?

Action: Mitch to chat with Jim.

- I chatted with the team about removing the spring on the ski school locker room door, unfortunately these springs can't be backed off or removed as it will likely cause more damage moving forward. A few options to reduce the smell in that room are:
 - Open the window in the room, this could be done every morning when the staff leave the room for their duties and then can be shut later in the day to help reheat the room to dry gear out overnight. If it's too cold during the day there is the heated lunch room beside mtn ops people can use.
 - Snow School staff can talk to lan & Penny about buying some air fresheners/fabreeze for the room.
 - Staff are also encouraged to bring their gear home and wash it if it is getting stinky.

I think if these steps are followed this problem should go away.

- Blue Line painted the same as last season, helped with ski groups.
 - Char checked with Patrol and painting cat track lines is not going happen regularly, if at all. It's nice to have at this
 point but the blue paint that is used sprays on folks & clothing when painting and the lines get rubbed off so it's not
 effective to maintain.
 - o To mitigate risk: know the terrain you are skiing, let the group know the conditions and what to watch for.

- AED: Char/Mitch to check out and report to JOHSC

- o First 61 Top, FA, Glory
- They are located at all first aid stations. Confirmed there are no public facing AED's. In the event one is needed it will be patrol or another first aid attendant who will bring one to the scene.

 - Request is for snowmobiles to use the far right side not the middle of sluice box as it causes a hazard when teaching beginners.
